Preparing Hearts for Easter

This year, February 14 isn't only Valentine's Day. It's also Ash Wednesday—the beginning of the season of Lent, in which Christians down through the ages have set aside time to prepare their hearts for the celebration of Easter. And here at Calvary, there are at least two ways that we'll be creating opportunities for all of us to do that preparation.

First, on February 14, we'll be offering a brief Ash Wednesday service at 6 o'clock in the sanctuary. Through prayer, music, and God's Word, we'll provide an opportunity to reflect on what Jesus did for us, so that we'll be ready to follow Jesus to the cross – and beyond it, to the empty tomb. This service will include the imposition of ashes for any who wish to receive it.

In addition, on Sunday, February 18, Pastor Alex will begin a new sermon series called, "On the Cross Road." Each week, we'll examine a passage from the gospel of Mark that helps us understand what it means to worship a Savior who calls us to take up our cross and follow Him.

This year, let's make sure that Easter is more than a celebration of "all things spring." Let's make it a life-changing encounter with the God who loved us enough to lay down His life for us.
