# Through the Bible in 2024?

If anyone out there is interested in a great Bible reading plan, the YouVersion Bible App has one called "The Bible Recap" by TaraLeigh Cobble. The plan organizes readings from the Bible chronologically, which has helped me so much in understanding

the flow of God's story. TaraLeigh also has a companion Podcast called "The Bible Recap" where she offers background and information on each day's reading. This duo has helped me to understand more of the bible and to build my biblical knowledge.

I've heard several people around church say that they'd like to read the entire Bible; or that they started in January, got behind, and stopped. I have fallen into the second category several times! But with the Bible app I can listen to the Bible while I do chores or work out; or I can read it visually in my own time. This makes it so much easier for me to keep up with the most current reading.

The reading plan can be done solo; or you can use the app to read along with others. I've been reading the Bible with two friends from home, which allows us to see who's completed each day's reading. It has been fun to encourage each other along the way if one of us has fallen behind. And here's another great feature: You can start your reading plan on any day of the year! So people don't have to feel pressured to start on January 1st.
