Conversations that Change Lives

A New Year of Backpack Ministry

It is a blessing to see how God continues to meet the needs of kids in our community through Calvary's Backpack program each year. But this ministry requires both a solid base of financial support and a team of dedicated volunteers to run effectively. That's why our annual Backpack Fund Drive will take place in September. And that's why we're already recruiting people who'd like to be involved in a more "hands on" way. Specific volunteer opportunities include:

- Shopping: This requires a large vehicle and the ability to load/unload food boxes.
- Packing: Join a group of 10-15 other volunteers to bag food items for delivery to Franklin.
- Distributing: Serve as one member of a two-person team that hands out food bags to classrooms at Franklin.

Too Busy to Grow? Make Time for Midweek Ministries!

The great Reformer Martin Luther once said, "I have so much to do today that I shall spend the first three hours in prayer." Of course, even the thought of spending three hours in prayer might scare many of us more than it encourages us. However, many scholars suggest that Luther was being more figurate than literal. And either way, he was making an important statement about priorities. Especially when our lives—and the lives of our children—are busy, one of the best ways we can cultivate the spiritual strength that allows us to navigate daily challenges is to invest first in our relationship with Christ. And thankfully, Calvary offers a simple way to make that investment! Our Midweek Ministry provides a regular opportunity for kids and adults to incorporate the priorities of Bible study, prayer, and Christian fellowship into their week.

This fall's Midweek Ministry kicks off on Wednesday, August 27. We encourage everyone to join us in the fellowship hall at 5:45 in the evening, so that we can share a word of prayer together. And then, at 6 o'clock, we head off into activities for all ages: Mission Friends for Pre-K and K children; Explorers for kids in grades 1 to 5, and Youth for students in junior high and high school. And don't forget: adults can grow, too! In our first session this fall, adults can choose between:

- "What Happens Next?"—a study that looks at the End Times through the eyes of faith instead of fear. As Lucado leads participants through history, he shows how each step is a part of God's intentional plan that moves us closer to our heavenly destiny. (facilitated by Jan Varney and Kim Morrison).
- "The Practice of Prayer"—an experiential study in which we dig into the Bible's teaching on prayer... and spend time praying! For the members of our group, our church, our community, and our world (facilitated by Dave McPeak Sr.)

Again, the growth begins Wednesday, Aug. 27. So what do you think? Do you have so much to do that you need to put Jesus first?

Not to Be Served, But to Serve!

Jesus spent much of his ministry serving others by meeting their needs. And since Jesus told his followers that he didn't come to *be* served but to serve (Mark 10:45); we, too, are called to be servants, sharing our time and talents to be a blessing to others.

That's the spirit that motivates Servant Sunday, which will take place on Sunday, October 19. On that day, Calvary will be suspending our regular *worship services*, so that we can *worship through serving*. And we've got a lot of great things planned! We encourage you to take a look at our current project list, so that you can be praying about the way that you and your family would like to put your gifts to work.



- Blessing Box Team: Meet needs by restocking local blessing boxes with food, clothing, and other supplies.
- Card Ministry: Bless members of our church and community by creating cards and writing notes of encouragement.
- "Holy Comforter" Knitting Group: Make lap blankets for local nursing homes and victims of flooding in Western NC.
- **Hygiene Packathon**: In partnership with "Feed the Hunger," a NC-based ministry that provides vital relief supplies around the world, we'll be packing almost 1500 hygiene bags that include a toothbrush, soap, washcloth, and bandaids.
- The Lunch Bunch: Prepare and deliver the lunch that will be served to all of our Servant Sunday participants
- Christmas in October: Fill 120 backpacks that will be distributed to students at Mount Park Elementary School as part of the Surry Baptist Association's Christmas Backpack ministry.
- Calvary Welcome Wagon: Prepare "outreach bags" that can be used by Calvary members to invite friends, clients, and folks who are new to our community to worship with us.
- Yokefellow Cleaning Crew: Help our local food bank meet the needs of hungry families by cleaning and arranging the food storage area.
- Homebound Blessing Team: Share brief visits with Calvary's homebound members while delivering lunch.
- Team Snack Attack: Prepare and deliver snack packages for hospital staff and waiting rooms.
- Paul Bunyan Brigade: Join us for a morning of wood-splitting, as we make sure that local friends in need have wood to heat their homes this winter.
- Road Redemption Project: Serve our neighbors and beautify our immediate community by collecting trash along South Franklin Road.
- The School Squad: Put your gardening, yardwork, and prayer skills to good use by doing a beautification project at and prayer walk at Tharrington Elementary.
- "Senior Sunshine" Project: Prepare fall door decorations for residents at Twelve Oaks.
- "Beauty of Holiness" Bunch: Bring joy to residents at Colonial Care by providing haircuts and nail painting.
- The Construction Crew: Bless a local family in need by providing a ramp or other home improvements.

Please begin praying about how you'd like to serve. And who knows? Maybe God will lay on your heart another project that would allow us to be a blessing to others. 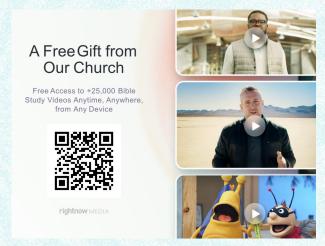
