## Glancing Back and Giving Thanks

Among the many reasons I'm thankful to be the pastor at Calvary is this: I almost never have to preach about "stewardship." Don't get me wrong. Stewardship is important, and Jesus had more to say about how we use our money than almost any other topic. However, the members of our church family have been so faithful in their giving, that I rarely feel the need to focus on it. And if that's been true "in general," it's been even more true of your stewardship in 2024.

The folks on our finance team recently completed their year-end summary of our income and expenses, and there's a lot to celebrate. For starters, your offerings to the general operating budget of the church totaled almost \$640,000, which—it's worth noting—was almost \$29,000 more than our budget! Of course, I hope you know that all those offerings do more than support our church. As a result of a long-standing commitment here at Calvary, 15% of our general offerings are used to support mission activities and mission partnerships that serve the Lord beyond our church. This means that more than \$95,000 of what you gave was used to share the gospel, meet needs, and bless others in our community and across the world.

But as deeply thankful as I am for all of that, I'm also grateful that you generously gave "above and beyond" your general offerings to support many other ministries that impact lives with the love of Christ: More than \$10,000 to feed children through the Franklin Backpack Program. More than \$2,000 to build ramps and prepare homes through the Handyman ministry of the Baptist Men. More than \$6,000 to support Andy and Cari Robertson's ministry in Central Africa. More than \$20,000 to support Hurricane Relief Efforts in Western North Carolina. The list goes on.

So, as we move deeper into 2025, let me express my heartfelt appreciation for your faithfulness. Faithfulness to our church? Absolutely! But even more, faithfulness to the God and Father who blesses us so that we can be a blessing! This year, I pray that we'll continue to be faithful to Him. Not only so that we can pay our staff, and keep the lights on, and purchase the supplies we need. (After all, I have no doubt that you'll continue to make that possible!) But also so that we can share the gospel, feed the hungry, encourage the hurting, and display the love of Jesus to a world that needs him so desperately.

Thank you for honoring him, with your hearts, with your lives...and with your wallets.

### Looking Ahead to Lent

Since very early in the history of the church, followers of Jesus have been setting aside the weeks before Easter, so they could prepare their hearts to remember the Lord's crucifixion and to celebrate his resurrection through prayer, repentance, and self-denial. This season of preparation is called "Lent" (from an Old English word for "spring"), and it begins with Ash Wednesday, when believers receive a mark made of ashes on their foreheads, since the scriptures associate ashes with repentance.

It turns out, however, that ashes in the Bible are connected to more than just repentance. Ashes figure prominently when people are confronting loss, weakness, their own mortality, their need for purity, and more. And by meditating on these other themes, we can open our hearts more fully to the preparation that Lent is meant to inspire.

That's why Calvary invites you to participate in a special time of worship on Ash Wednesday called "The Seven Symbols of Ash." Through a series of interactive prayer stations, worshipers will have the opportunity to meditate on some of the many lessons that ashes can teach. But to allow each person to consider these lessons at his or her own pace, this will be a "self-guided" service. Beginning at 4 o'clock on Wednesday evening, March 5, and running until 7 o'clock, the sanctuary will be open, and Pastor Alex will be present to get you started, so that you can pray for as little time—or as much time—as you need.

We hope that you'll be able to join us! And as an added incentive, those who participate will receive a daily devotional guide for Lent, so they can continue their preparation for Easter by meditating on the life and ministry of Jesus.
