The time for Vacation Bible School has finally arrived! "Concrete & Cranes: Building on the Love of Jesus" will take place June 13 to 16 and will run from 6 o'clock to 8:20 each evening. This year's theme verse is Philippians 1:6—"He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus," and everyone who participates—children, youth, and adults—will learn more about how we can be "wise builders" who cooperate with God to construct lives that honor Him.

Activities begin each evening with a Snack Supper that will be served in the Fellowship Hall from 6 to 6:30. The Opening Assembly will run from 6:30 to 6:45, and it will be followed by Music, Bible Study, and Recreation for all our children and youth helpers. Adults are invited and encouraged to participate in the Snack Supper and Opening Assembly, but their schedule will start "officially" at 6:45 in the Chapel with some fellowship and refreshments, followed by a study of Nehemiah from 7 to 8. The evening concludes with a Closing Assembly at 8 o'clock.

After missing VBS last year because of the pandemic, we're looking forward to a being together and celebrating the work that God continues to do among us. COVID, a Congregation, and the Mind of Christ

The recent weeks here at Calvary have been so encouraging. After a long year of online services, social distancing, and mask wearing, we're finally starting to "get back to normal." People are returning to worship, and Sunday School classes are back in session. Children are being dedicated, and guests are visiting. Masks are coming off, and handshakes are being given. All of us, I think, are eager to put the pandemic behind us and get on with the fellowship, growth, and ministry to which God has called us.

Of course, things aren't quite "back to normal" yet! There are still a few concerns about the vulnerability of children and unvaccinated adults. And we're still waiting for good guidance on when we can return to congregational singing. And as we wait and work through those issues, we want to do everything in our power to trust God, to have the fullest church experience possible, *and* to do this without putting anyone at risk unnecessarily.

So, as your pastor, here's what I ask. First, please be patient. Our deacons will make decisions about what works best for our church based on good information and their prayerful discernment of God's will. Let's trust them to do what's right and not rush ahead of them based on our personal preferences or on what we see happening elsewhere. Second, please pray. The deacons and I need God's wisdom on this, and He promises to provide it to those who ask. Third, please get vaccinated. Now clearly, if your doctor says you have risk factors that make that unwise, vou need to take that seriously. But while I'm no expert, I believe the vaccine is safe and that it's neither "the mark of the beast" nor a government tracking tool. And the more we get people protected, the more easily we can get back to normal. And finally, in all of this let's have "the mind of Christ" by "valuing others above ourselves and not looking to our own interests but also to the interests of others" (Phil. 2:3-5). God has done and will do great things here at Calvary, and I can't wait to see what He has in store!
