Adam Mabry is the lead pastor of Alethia Church in Boston, Massachusetts, and the author of *The Art of Rest: Faith to Hit Pause in a World that Never Stops*. A dynamic speaker, Adam has learned the importance of rest through his experience planting churches in both Scotland and Boston. He holds degrees from Reformed Theological Seminary and Gordon Conwell Theological Seminary, and he writes frequently for The Gospel Coalition, EveryNation.org, and NewChurches.com. His wife Hope is an educator and photographer, and they have four children: Alanna, Nora, Cole, and Wyatt.

Adam will be leading a seminar on *The Art of Rest* on Saturday, June 11, from 9 am to Noon in the Fellowship Hall (a continental breakfast and time of fellowship will begin at 8:30). Through biblical teaching, personal testimony, and shared discussion, he'll help us see the value and importance of rest and will



share some of the practical steps we can take to incorporate rest into our lives. Adam will also be our guest preacher in worship on Sunday, June 12, when he will speak about *Finding Sabbath*.




Youth Mission Pittsburgh
