

Back to Normal or On to Extraordinary?

If you haven't noticed, our church is taking some important steps toward getting "back to normal" after the long, difficult year of the coronavirus pandemic. Most visibly, we have returned to our "pre-Covid" worship schedule on Sunday mornings, which means that we're now sharing contemporary worship at 8:30, Bible study at 9:45, and traditional worship at 10:55. Of course, I understand that some of our members aren't quite ready to come back just yet. But as more people get vaccinated and as cases continue to decline, it's my sincere prayer that we all be able to move forward enthusiastically in worship, growth, and service.

Of course, you might have heard the old adage: "God never wastes a hurt." And it seems to me that it would be a great shame to wastes the "hurts" of this past year by simply returning to the "same old" patterns of church life without considering how the Lord might want to grow us as a result of what we've been through. Could there be new ways that Christ wants us to deepen our discipleship or to stay connected as a church family? Might there be new opportunities for reaching out to others and blessing our community? How is God calling us to new commitments in both personal and corporate prayer and worship? Our willingness to ask these and other, similar questions will play a big role in determining the extent to which God is able "in all things (including the coronavirus) to work for the good of those who love Him, who've been called according to His purpose."

You'll notice, I hope, that we've even made some "physical improvements" at church to demonstrate that we want to move forward rather than backward. We've renovated the church entrance at the end of the educational building, and we've installed a new digital sign out front that will enable us to communicate more effectively with people as they drive by. But this work on our facility means little unless it's accompanied by the more important work that God wants to do in our hearts. So in these weeks ahead, let's pray that God will do more than help us "get back to normal." Let's pray that God will move us "forward to extraordinary," as we seek Him, serve Him, and love Him with all of our hearts.


Another Opportunity for "Praying with Jesus"

During the season of Lent, Pastor Alex is sharing a series of sermons called, "Praying with Jesus." Each week, he's inviting us to focus on one of the prayers that Jesus prayed in the gospels, so that we can experience the relationship that our Lord shared with his Heavenly Father. For those, however, who would like to learn even more about prayer by sitting at the feet of Jesus, Pastor Alex would like to offer an additional opportunity.

With Christ in the School of Prayer is a classic work of Christian devotion that was written by Andrew Murray, a pastor and writer of Scottish descent who served as a missionary in South Africa in the late 1800's and early 1900's. The book itself has 31 relatively brief chapters—perfect for reading as a daily devotional during the month of March. And because the work is in the public domain, we can make digital copies (pdf format) available for free.

Won't you allow Jesus to take you into the Father's presence as He prepares us for the celebration of his resurrection?


