

A Visit from Our Missionaries

On Sunday, October 3, Calvary will receive a special visit from Andy and Cari Robertson, our missionaries to Chad. Andy and Cari are back in the states this fall, reconnecting with friends and supporters. And they'll be visiting with us to share stories, to lead us in worship, and to answer questions about their ministry. You'll have three opportunities to spend time with them:

- During the Sunday School hour, everyone is invited to join us in the Fellowship Hall for an interactive session in which Andy and Cari will be telling us about developments in their life and ministry and fielding your questions about Chad, their work, and their future.
- In both worship services, Andy and Cari will be sharing God's Word with us, allowing scripture and their missions experience to encourage us in the pursuit of our mission.
- Finally, at 1 o'clock in the afternoon on the 3rd, supporters from Calvary and beyond will gather in the Fellowship Hall to get a more detailed picture of ministry in Chad, the challenges it presents, and how we can support Andy and Cari as they prepare for their return to Central Africa.

The Robertson's ministry is one of the ways that our church family is participating in the Great Commission. We encourage you to join us as we consider what it takes to "make disciples of all nations."





Online @ Calvary

When asked to enter a password, type "CalvaryBC" (case sensitive); and then, when prompted, accept the terms of our wireless system. This will give you wi-fi access for 24 hours.

By now, many in our church family should have received an email invitation to check out "RightNow Media," a new resource that Calvary is making available to support your growth in Christ. Hopefully, you've used that invitation to create an account and to begin checking out the practically limitless learning opportunities that RightNow Media offers. Of course, if all you've done is to visit the RightNow website or open the RightNow app, it might look a



little overwhelming. So let me encourage you to take a more focused approach by asking yourself, "What do I need to grow?"

You see, rather than seeing RightNow as a library of video Bible studies, I'd encourage you to think of it as a workshop full of "life tools." And the challenge (or is it an opportunity?) is to find the right tool for the job you need to do. Do you need to know more about the scriptures and how they apply to life? Well, if you look at the list of "libraries" that are available in RightNow, you'll see that you can dive into "Books of the Bible," "Theology and Doctrine," and/or "Christian Living." If your needs are a bit more "practical," there are also libraries related to "Mental Health," "Marriage," "Parenting," "Biblical Finance," not to mention some excellent resources for nurturing and entertaining your kids!

Especially in this age of COVID, I think we've seen that if the only way to grow is to get everyone together at church on Sunday morning, growth is going to be hard to come by. That doesn't mean, of course, that what we do together as church doesn't matter; far from it! But unless each of us individually is seeking Christ, it's going to be difficult for all of us corporately to grow in Christ. And we want to give you and your family everything you need to know and serve Him more.

What Will You Hear from the Pulpit in 2022?

It's that time of year! Time for Pastor Alex to get away for a few days to *pray about* and to *plan for* the sermons that he hopes to preach in the coming year. And as always, he'd like to get **your input**, so that he can develop his messages with your needs and questions in mind. That's why you'll be given an opportunity to complete a "Sermon Input Survey" this month. Surveys will be included as a bulletin insert on Sunday, October 10. But they'll be available in the sanctuary lobby, the church office, and the information centers during much of the month. If you take the time to complete and return a survey, you'll be doing the pastor (and yourself) a big favor. And even if you can't complete a survey, you can make your voice heard by sending the pastor a note or email in which you answer any of these questions:

- In what ways do you feel a need to grow your faith? (What ideas do you need to understand? What spiritual practices do you need to develop? What challenges do you need to overcome? What questions do you need to answer?)
- What issues or challenges are you wrestling with in your life?
- Are there books of the Bible, biblical characters, or key beliefs that you'd like to know more about?
- What kinds of sermons would you be most eager to invite your friends to hear?
- Are there any other comments you can share about the pastor's preaching (including constructive criticism) that could help him serve you through his preaching ministry?

As most of you know, Calvary uses an automated phone service called "One Call Now" to deliver information to our members. Everything from daily devotionals to weather cancellations and from prayer requests to weekend reminders can be easily sent to just those who want them. However, we're discovering that if we want to make sure people receive only the messages they want, we need to refine our system.

This month, we plan to move to a set up in which everyone our system (and who hasn't opted out of our messages entirely) will automatically get "emergency notices," like weather cancellations. However, to receive "daily devotionals," "prayer requests," or "weekend reminders" (when they're sent), we'd like to ask you to "opt in" to those messages. To do this, you can complete the mini-form that will be part of the bulletin tear-off this month; or you can call or email the church office.



Please help us to keep you "in the know" without bombarding you with things you don't want to know! And thank you for your interest in the things that God is doing in the life of our church.
